RESEARCH BOOTCAMP STATE UNIVERSITY OF JAKARTA WITH UNIVERSITY MALAYSIA SABAH IN ACCESSING INDEXED JOURNALS, PARAPHRASING, GRAMMAR CHECKING, AND REFERENCE MANAGEMENT

Abstract

Higher education institutions are under increasing pressure to produce globally competitive graduates by significantly increasing their research output and scientific publications, thus strengthening and enhancing their academic reputation and social impact. Yet, lecturers and students at the service location must gain skills in research-supporting software, scientific writing, and literature searching. Therefore, the State University of Jakarta and the University Malaysia Sabah jointly organize a research boot camp to address the rising demand for research competence and international publications in higher education by equipping participants with essential research skills. The Research Bootcamp Training aims to enhance research competency among students by providing online training in accessing indexed journals, paraphrasing, grammar checking, and reference management using relevant software. This program seeks to assist students at partner institutions in writing and publishing academic articles. With this activity, more students can publish their scientific work in national and international journals indexed by Scopus and Web of Science, thus improving the quality of research in Indonesia. In addition, this activity is expected to encourage the birth of a generation of young researchers who are productive and able to produce quality scientific works relevant to current problems.

INTRODUCTION

In the 21st century, higher education institutions face increasing pressure to enhance competitiveness and produce globally competent graduates. Requires a significant investment in research and publication. Recognizing the challenges lecturers and students face in conducting research, particularly in writing scientific articles, the State University of Jakarta has partnered with University Malaysia Sabah to organize a "Research Bootcamp Training to Enhance Research Competence." This initiative aims to equip participants with essential research skills, focusing on publishing in international journals. By fostering a collaborative research environment and enhancing the research capacity of both institutions, this program seeks to contribute to advancing knowledge and innovation in the region.

Based on the background outlined above, there are partner issues in this community service program, including (1) a lack of skills among lecturers and students at the service location in using research-supporting software such as Quillbot, Grammarly, and Mendeley, (2) inadequate ability of lecturers and students at the service location to write scientific articles and publications, and (3)

insufficient knowledge among lecturers and students at the service location in searching for the latest scientific journal articles to support research.

Our community service partner, University Malaysia Sabah, faces challenges in basic academic writing skills. To address these issues, we recognize the need to enhance research competency through better academic writing and publication skills, crucial indicators of student graduation. Our community service team has designed various activities to support these basic skills, mainly through the Research Bootcamp Training program. This initiative, aimed at students within and outside the State University of Jakarta, seeks to equip them with the ability to write academic articles for publication in national and international journals. The training provides essential skills such as accessing indexed journals, paraphrasing with Quillbot, checking grammar with Grammarly, and managing references with Mendeley. Conducted online via Zoom due to the geographical location of the partner campus, the Research Bootcamp includes sessions by experts like Nur Syifa Nadiastuti, an Outstanding Student of Universitas Negeri Jakarta, who guides participants in using tools like Publish or Perish and ScienceDirect. Additionally, Dr. Muhammad Yusuf, SE., M.M., Faculty Of Economics Lecturer at Universitas Negeri Jakarta, demonstrates effective grammar checking with Grammarly. By the end of the training, participants are expected to proficiently access, paraphrase, check grammar, and manage references for their academic writing, thereby enhancing their research competence.

LITERATURE REVIEW

Plagiarism is a significant issue in research. Traditionally, researchers have manually paraphrased text by summarizing, using synonyms, restructuring sentences, or rewriting content. However, this method is time-consuming for large amounts of text. Researchers now have access to software tools like Quillbot to address this challenge. These tools can assist students in rewriting text and provide an alternative to manual paraphrasing (Fitria, 2022).

In an increasingly competitive academic world, searching for reputable journals is one of the determinants of good references. The "publish or perish" application is an intelligent solution for overcoming this challenge. With a comprehensive journal database, the app allows academics to track their own and colleagues' publication performance. In addition, this application has been proven to be successful in improving the participants' ability to write scientific papers, such as in Afandi, Erdayani, & Afandi (2023)

METHOD AND PROCEDURES

The Basic Skills Training in Academic Writing (Research Bootcamp) will be conducted using lecture (material presentation), practice, and discussion methods to ensure that the material is well-received by participants/partners. The activities to be carried out in this community service program include participant identification and target setting, needs identification, training implementation, and activity evaluation. This activity is organized by the proposing team from Universitas Negeri Jakarta

due to the need for more skills among partner students and within the campus related to software supporting academic writing (article composition).

The training activities consist of:

- 1. Accessing indexed national and international journals.
- 2. Paraphrasing activities using Quillbot software.
- 3. Grammar checking and correction using Grammarly software.
- 4. Referencing management using Mendeley Software.




Figure 2 Opening speech from Dr. Indra Pahala, M.Si.




Figure 4 Presentation of topic 1 by Nur Syifa Nadiastuti

The event's main activities took place between 09:50 and 11:10 WIB. Before the session began, attendees were advised to obtain the required software. The speaker presented the topic through a

combination of lectures and hands-on practice. A question-and-answer period followed, during which participants actively engaged by asking multiple questions. Only three questions were permitted. Participants inquired about application operation, usage difficulties, and comparable software options. The goal was to equip participants with the tools to produce articles more rapidly and effortlessly in their work.

After the explanation of the material and the question-and-answer session, the event continued with the closing ceremony and the evaluation of activities by participants. This evaluation was conducted online to assess the event's success. The results of the event evaluation were:




Figure 6 The results of the evaluation regarding the mastering of the topic by the speaker




Figure 7 The results of the evaluation regarding the presentation of the topic by the speaker




Figure 8 Results of the evaluation on the relevance of participants' needs and expectations

The results of this evaluation showed that 65% of participants strongly agreed and 35% agreed that the speaker mastered the material well, 58% of participants strongly agreed and 40% agreed that the speaker presented the material well, and 62% of participants strongly agreed and 36% agreed that the topic of this activity was based on the participant's needs and expectations.
